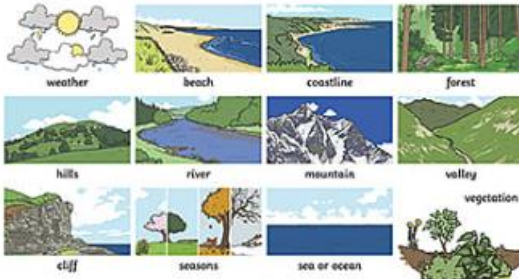

Vocabulary

Human Features	Things that have been built by people. For example, houses, roads, shops, towns, schools and bridges.
Physical Features	Things that have not been made by people and that are natural around the world. For example, seas, mountains, seasons, valleys and forests.
Key	A little box of information found on a map. It helps you read it more clearly.
Compass	A tool for finding direction.
4 points	The four main compass directions: North, South, East and West.
Directional language	Key words that are relevant to point out directions. Such as left, right, centre, middle and top.
